

SUMMARY OF PARSHA 'BEREISHIS' MOVING INTO PARSHA "NOAHIC"—IEWISH CONCEPTS TYING THESE TWO PORTIONS TOGETHER

- **BEREISHIS** Creation and Ultimate Demise of the World Except for Noah and Family (Part A)
 - G-d created the world and gave humanity the mission of transforming it/ruling over it as it was to be His home; his Divine presence communing and walking with manking. What He created was GOOD...He defines good for His guests. Also, our purpose in this plan was good works.
 - New American Standard Bible Ephesians 2:10
 For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them.
 - Mankind sinned causing a spiritual separation between mankind and G-d and the resulting sin gets so bad over time that the world needed to be destroyed...the world needs to be fixed.
 (tikkun olam) The world and mankind had to be altered to bring it back to its ultimate and true fulfillment.
- **NOAHIC** Repair of the Physical World (Part B)
 - G-d chose water...water symbolizes the ability to spiritually purify. Using water in the form of a "mikveh" (ritual bath) or ritual immersion symbolically depicts death and rebirth and a person becomes a new entity when they emerge. This concept is being introduced in a much grander scheme.
 - G-d, in His salvation plan, makes a way for repentance. He pauses, giving people time to repent **(teshuvah)** However, in the number of years that Noah built the ark, not one person repented....not one! (120 yrs)
 - So G-d re-creates and parallels the first creation; but some things are different!



[NOACH]

⁹These are the toldot of Noach; Noach was an ish tzaddik and tamim among those of his time, and Noach's halachah was with HaElohim.

¹⁰ And Noach fathered three banim: Shem, Cham, and Yephet.

- ¹¹ Ha'aretz also was corrupt before HaElohim, and ha'aretz was filled with chamas.
- ¹² And Elohim looked upon ha'aretz, and, hinei, it was corrupt; for kol basar had corrupted his derech upon ha'aretz.
- ¹³ And Elohim said unto Noach, The ketz (end) of kol basar is come before Me; for ha'aretz is filled with chamas because of them; and, hineni, I will destroy them with ha'aretz.
- ¹⁴ Make thee a **tevah** (ark) of gopher wood; rooms shalt thou make in the tevah (ark), and shalt coat it within and without with **tar**.
- ¹⁵ And this is how thou shalt build it: the length of the tevah (ark) shall be three hundred cubits, the width of it fifty cubits, and the height of it thirty cubits.
- ¹⁶ A roof shalt thou make to the tevah (ark), and thou shalt finish it to a cubit from the top; and the door of the (ark) shalt thou set in the side thereof; with lower, second, and third decks shalt thou make it.

¹⁷ And, hineni, I, even I, do bring a mabbul of waters upon ha'aretz, to destroy kol basar, wherein is the ruach chayyim, from under Shomayim; and everything that is in ha'aretz shall perish.

Lots of repitition going on...must be something important!

Plan of Salvation – alongside of 'atonement'

Hebrew word for pitch is kaphar which means atonement



PATTERN OF 'SALVATION'

1 – Mankind was wicked and G-d would soon destroy them/they would be destroyed

#2-There is a way to escape the destruction

#3-The means of escape was designed by the Lord and only that means was available - GRACE

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4 – Noah would have to ACT in order for his deliverance to come about. It is NOT a passive acknowledgment or intellectual acquiescence.

This is something that divides the Christian church and the Jewish people.

PROMISE OF NORHIC COVENANT

Genesis 8:14 - 9:17

- ¹⁸ But with thee will I establish My brit (covenant); and thou shalt come into the tevah (ark), thou, and thy banim, and thy isha, and the nashim of thy banim with thee.
- ¹⁹ And of every living thing of kol basar, two of every kind shalt thou bring into the tevah (ark), to keep them alive with thee; they shall be zachar and nekevah.
- ²⁰ Of birds after their kind, and of behemah after their kind, of every remes of ha'adamah after its kind, two of every kind shall come unto thee, to keep them alive.
- ²¹ And take thou unto thee of all food that is eaten, and thou shalt gather it to thee; and it shall be for ochel for thee, and for them.
- ²²Thus did Noach; according to all that Elohim commanded him, so did he.

WHAT IS A COVENANT? NEW TERMINOLOGY INTRODUCED

 DEFINITION: A legally binding relationship between two or more parties (they are permanent)

- Covenants are binding/permanent
- Covenants are intergenerational
- Covenant terms and conditions are to be fulfilled by both parties
- Covenants were to be mutually beneficial for both parties
- Breaking a covenant has dire consequences
- A broken covenant requires atonement

A Covenant given to a people who were not yet "Jewish"....Question...what does that mean to us as Gentiles?





FOOD... (IN LIGHT OF OUR NEW'S YEARS RESOLUTIONS...)

Review Genesis 1:29-30

29 And G-d said, Hinei, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which is upon the face of kol ha'aretz (all the earth), and every etz (tree), in the which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed; to you it shall be for food.

30 And to every beast of the earth, and to every fowl of the air, and to every thing that creepeth upon the earth, wherein there is life, I have given every green herb for food; and it was so.

Up To This Point:

- Food for mankind and animals was plants and plants alone.
 This was by G-d's own definition.
- Who gets to define "food"?
- The first choice given...centered around food. What does this say alone?
- Words in the Bible..."kosher", "authorized", "clean"...are never used as a modifier to the word "FOOD". It would have been redundant. Food was only things that are divinely authorized, and ritually clean, and meant to be eaten.
- So why (7) of certain kinds of animals???
 - TO BE CONTINUED AS WE MOVE FORWARD...

CENESIS-CHAPTER # 7



NOAH AND HIS FINAL INSTRUCTIONS

 And Hashem said unto Noach, Come thou and all thy bais into the tevah (ark); for thee have I found tzaddik before Me in dor hazeh. 2 Of every behemah hatehorah (clean) thou shalt take to thee by sevens; the male and his mate; and of behemah that are not tehorah by two, the male and his mate. 3 Of also Oph HaShomayim by sevens, the zachar and the nekevah; to keep zera alive upon the face of kol ha'aretz. 4 For/ shivah yamim (7 days) from now, and I will cause it to rain upon ha'aretz arba'im yom and arba'im lailah; and every living creature that I have made will I wipe out from off the p'nei ha'adamah. 5 And Noach did according unto all that Hashem commanded him.6 And Noach was shesh me'ot shanah when the mabbul waters were upon ha'aretz.

Hebrews 11:7 ⁷By faith Noah, when warned about things not yet seen, in holy fear built an ark to save his family. By his faith he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness that is in keeping with faith.





7 And Noach entered in, and his banim, and his isha, and nashim of his banim with him, into the tevah (ark), because of the waters of the mabbul. 8 Of behemah hatehorah, and of behemah that are not tehorah, and of haoph, and of every thing that creepeth upon ha'adamah, 9 There went in shnayim shnayim (two by two) unto Noach into the tevah (ark), the zachar and the nekevah, as Elohim had commanded Noach. 10 And it came to pass after shivat hayamim, that the waters of the mabbul were upon ha'aretz. 11 In the six hundredth year of Noach's life, in the second month, the seventeenth day of the month, the same day were all the fountains of the great deep burst open, and the floodgates of Shomayim were opened. 12 And the geshem (rain) was upon ha'aretz arba'im yom and arba'im lailah.

SOLEMN PAUSE

There was also a pause before the judgements in Revelation 8:1 After the seventh seal was opened; heaven was silent for what seemed like half an hour.

 7 – Day Pause – before G-d poured out His devastation upon the world.

- Was it time for those who were outside the ark to reconsider?


Reality of Duality

NUMBERS ARE IMPORTANT IN JEWISH WRITINGS...

- Numbers can be both literal and symbolic at the same time
- 40 Second most used number in the Bible (References TRIALS or TESTS)
 - Can also be used as a period of time; it can mark a passing from one era into another
 - Rained for 40 days and nights
 - Moses was on Mt. Sinai without food for 40 days
 - Jesus fasted in the wilderness for 40 days before being tempted
 - Spies of Israel went to scout out the inhabitants of the land of Canaan for 40 days
 - Ninevah was granted 40 days of repentance
 - 40 days is purification time for a new mother who bore a son; 80 days for a daughter
 - Moses led Israel for 40 years
 - King David & Solomon each ruled Israel 40 years



ARK OF SALVATION - G-D SHUTS THEM IN...

• 13 On that very yom entered Noach, and Shem, and Cham, and Yephet, the bnei Noach, and Noach's isha, and the three nashim of his banim with them, into the tevah (ark); 14 They, and every beast after its kind, and kol habehemah after their kind, and every remes that crawls upon ha'aretz after its kind, and kol haoph after its kind, every bird of every sort. 15 And they went in unto Noach into the tevah (ark), shnayim shnayim of kol habasar, wherein is the ruach chayyim. 16 And they that went in, went in zachar and nekevah of kol basar, as Elohim had commanded him; then **Hashem shut him in**


REMINDER: (pg 50) If you want a more satisfying way to understand the Torah and the whole Bible, cease asking why, instead look for the pattern, and that will explain G-d's mind on the matter to the extent that He has chosen to reveal it to us.



THE CLOSED DOOR...

- G-d commanded Noah to place a door on the side of the ark. In Chasidic teaching, the door in the ark symbolizes "REPENTANCE"
- The Master taught that to escape the coming judgment, one needed to repent and pass through the narrow door to enter G-d's salvation.

Luke 13:23"Lord," someone asked
Him, "will only a few people be
saved?" Jesus answered, 24"Make
every effort to enter through the
narrow door. For many, I tell you, will
try to enter and will not be able.
25After the master of the house gets
up and shuts the door, you will stand
outside knocking and saying, 'Lord,
open the door for us.' But he will reply,
'I do not know where you are from.'...





ALL LIFE ENDS...EXCEPT FOR THAT IN THE ARK

• 17 And the mabbul was arba'im yom upon ha'aretz; and the waters increased, and lifted up the tevah (ark), and it rose above ha'aretz. 18 And the waters rose, and were increased greatly upon ha'aretz; and the tevah (ark) floated upon the face of the waters. 19 And the waters rose exceedingly upon ha'aretz; and all the high hills, that were under kol HaShomayim, were covered. 20 Fifteen cubits upward did the waters rise; and the harim were covered. 21 And kol basar perished that moved upon ha'aretz, both of Oph, and of Behemah, and of Beast, and of every Swarming Thing that swarms upon ha'aretz, and kol haadam; 22 All in whose nostrils was the ruach chayyim, of all that was in the dry land, perished. 23 And every living creature was wiped out which was upon the p'nei haadamah, both Adam, and Behemah, and the Remes, and the Oph HaShomayim; and they were wiped out from ha'aretz: and Noach only remained alive, and they that were with him in the tevah (ark). 24 And the waters flooded upon ha aretz a hundred and fifty days.



DATES OF THE FLOOD EVENTS...

- Flood began on 17th day of the 2nd month of the 600th year of Noah's life. (Gen 7:11a)so for 5 months (150 days) until next event
- And the ark rested in the 7th month, on the 17th day of the month, upon the mountains of Ararat (Gen 8)
- And the waters decreased continually until the 10th month: in the 10th month, on the 1st day of the month, were the tops of the mountains seen
- And it came to pass in the six hundred and first year, in the 1st month, the 1st day of the month (TISREI), the waters were dried up from off the earth: and Noah removed the covering of the ark, and looked, and, behold, the face of the ground was dried (Gen 8:13)
 - This date is know as ROSH HASHANAH/FEAST OF TRUMPETS...Jewish New Year

PARALLEL'S TO THE 1ST CREATION?

 And Elohim remembered Noach, and every living thing, and all the behemah that was with him in the tevah (ark); and Elohim made a ruach to pass over ha'aretz, and the waters subsided; 2 The ma'ayanot (springs) also of the tehom and the floodgates of Shomayim were stopped, and the geshem from Shomayim was restrained; 3 And the waters receded from on ha'aretz continually; and after the end of the hundred and fifty days the waters were abated. 4 And the tevah (ark) rested in the seventh month, on the seventeenth day of the month, upon the mountains of Ararat. 5 And the waters decreased continually until the tenth month; in the tenth month, on the first day of the month, were the rashei heharim seen. 6 And it came to pass at the end of arba'im yom, that Noach opened the chalon (window) of the tevah (ark) which he had made; $\frac{7}{2}$ And he sent forth the oxev (raven), which went forth to and fro, until the waters were dried up from off ha'aretz. 8 Also he sent forth a yonah (dove) from him, to see if the waters were abated from off the face of the adamah; 9 But the yonah found no manoach (place of rest) for the sole of her foot, and she returned unto him into the tevah, for the waters were on the p'nei kol ha'aretz; then he reached forth his yad, and took her, and pulled her in unto him into the texah (ark). 10 And he waited yet another shivat yamim; and again he sent forth the yonah out of the tevah (ark); 11 And the yonah returned to him in the erev; and, hinei, in her beak was a zayit (olive) leaf freshly plucked; so Noach had da'as that the mayim were abated from off ha'aretz. 12 And he waited yet another shivat yamim; and sent forth the yonah; which returned not unto him again.



Chiasm

- A chiasm (also called a chiasmus) is a literary device in which a sequence of ideas is presented and then repeated in reverse order. The result is a "mirror" effect as the ideas are "reflected" back in a passage. Each idea is connected to its "reflection" by a repeated word, often in a related form. The term chiasm comes from the Greek letter chi, which looks like our letter X
 - When the GOING (A)
 - Gets TOUGH (B)
 - The TOUGH (B1)
 - Get GOING (A1)

What is the Center to the Sabbath

- Exodus 31:15'For six days work may be done, but on the seventh day there is a sabbath of complete rest,
- G-d Stops Creating
 - Creation cannot happen forever or you will eventually destroy it under the weight of change and it will never be enjoyed as a complete and independent work of art (imagine an artist: painter or musician)
- Disciplined Creativity
 - Creation cannot be independent unless it is released to be enjoyed and can operate in a relationship with its creator

What is the Center to the Rainbow

- Genesis 9:13b 14a "and it shall be for a sign of a covenant between Me and the earth.
 14"It shall come about, when I bring a cloud over the earth,"
- G-d Stops Destroying
- Disciplined Creativity
 - Creation is independent and can enjoy and operate in relationship with its creator

GARDEN VS VINEYARD

Center of the Garden

- Genesis 3:7 Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loin coverings.
- Eyes were open realization of "nakedness"
- Desire that went the wrong way; damaging relationships and futures

Center of the Vineyard

- Genesis 9:24 When Noah awoke from his wine, he knew what his youngest son had done to him.
- Eyes were open realization of "nakedness
- Desire that went the wrong way; damaging relationship and futures






SO... WHERE DID THE ARK LAND?

MOUNTAINS OF ARARAT

- NOT Mt. Ararat, rather the Ararat Mountain Range
- In modern day Turkey
- Ark rested on 7th month, the 17th day






- 13 And it came to pass in the six hundredth and first year, in the first month, the first day of the month, the mayim were dried up from off ha'aretz; and Noach removed the mikhseh (covering) of the tevah (ark), and looked, and, hinei, the surface of the adamah was dry. 14 And in the second month, on the seven and twentieth day of the month, was ha'aretz dry. 15 And Elohim spoke unto Noach, saying, 16 Go forth of the tevah (ark), thou, and thy isha, and thy banim, and the nashim of thy banim with thee. 17 Bring forth with thee every living thing that is with thee, of kol basar, both of bird, and of behemah, and of every creeping thing that creepeth upon ha'aretz; that they may multiply abundantly on ha'aretz, and be fruitful, and increase upon ha'aretz. 18 And Noach went forth, and his banim, and his isha, and the nashim of his banim with him; 19 Every animal, every remes, and every bird, and whatsoever creepeth upon ha'aretz, after their kinds, went forth out of the tevah (ark).
- 20 And Noach built a Mizbe'ach unto Hashem; and took of every behemah hatehorah, and of kol haoph hatahor, and offered olot (burnt offerings) on the Mizbe'ach. 21 And Hashem smelled a re'ach hannichoach; and Hashem said in His lev, I will not again curse the adamah any more ba'avur (because of) haAdam; for the yetzer of the lev haAdam is rah from his ne'urim (youth, childhood); neither will I again strike any more every thing living, as I have done.
- 22 While ha'aretz remaineth, zera (seedtime) and katzir (harvest), and kor (cold) and chom (heat), and kayitz (summer) and choref (winter), and yom and lailah shall not cease.



THE OLD IS PURIFIED, AND THE NEW IS SANCTIFIED

- Only through death, does new life come
- Vs. 20 Altar sacrifice as Noach's first act
- Each species of CLEAN animal was sacrificed
- If only ONE pair of clean animals had been brought, extinction would have been the result





FIVE TYPES OF SACRIFICE — "DRAWING NEAR"

Description	Hebrew Name	Scripture
Burnt Offering – "that which rises"; worship/gift offering	Olah	Leviticus 1:1-17; 6:8-13
Grain (or Animal) Offering – gift/tribute	Minchah – Jewish terminology also refers to the time of afternoon prayer (which also refers to the temple's sacrificial services)	Leviticus 2:1-16; 6:14-23
Peace Offering – represents peace and mutual goodwill between G-d and the worshipper	Shelami – (form of "shalom")	Leviticus 3:1-17; 7:11-36

THE SIX SEASONS

Changes...1. the Lord would never curse the ground or 2. destroy ALL life by flood (chap #9) as He just did. He then took an oath to continue the cycle of seasons so long as the earth remains.

Winter (Coref)	February – March
Harvest (Katzir)	April – May
Summer (Kayitz)	June – July
Heat (Chom)	August - September

GENESIS-CHAPTER # 9



THINGS ARE DIFFERENT THAN BEFORE

G-D MAKES COVENANT WITH NOAH

WHAT IS A COVENANT? NEW TERMINOLOGY INTRODUCED

- DEFINITION: A formal declaration of a legally binding relationship between two or more parties (they are permanent)
- Covenants are binding/permanent (WITH WHOM?)
- Covenants are intergenerational (APPLY TODAY?)
- Covenant terms and conditions are to be fulfilled by both parties (bilateral) sometimes they are unilateral.
- Covenants were to be mutually beneficial for both parties
- Breaking a covenant has dire consequences
- A broken covenant requires atonement
- Usually involved animal sacrifices
- Most often had a "sign" that accompanied
 - Sign in a marriage covenant
 - Sign in Abraham's covenant
 - Sign in the New Covenant

One of these covenants was given to a people who were not yet "Jewish"....

Question...what does that mean to us as Gentiles?





NOAHIDE LAWS

(PRECURSOR TO TORAH) — SIN CANNOT BE IMPUTED WHEN THERE IS NO TORAH (RO 5:13)

- 1. Do not worship idols or other gods
- 2. Do not blaspheme G-d's name (sages got this one from Job's story)
- 3. Do not murder (different from manslaughter)
- 4. Do not commit sexual immorality linked to be fruitful and multiply
- 5. Do not steal
- 6. Do not eat things while they are still alive (ie meat with blood)
- 7. Establish courts of justice

COMPARE TO ACTS 15

- 1. Abstain from things polluted by idols
- 2. Abstain from fornication
- 3. Abstain from what is strangled
- 4. Abstain from eating blood

It is supposed that because of the existence of the Laws of Noah, the apostles felt no need to write out a new Torah for the Gentiles or to spell out the obvious moral and ethical statues of Judaism such as prohibitions on murder, theft, idolatry, etc.

ALSO In the language of Torah, certain laws apply to both the Jew and the stranger who sojourns in the midst of the people of Israel (not all Gentiles...but those in the midst of the Hebrews). All four of the apostolic decrees belong to that category of laws. (Read Leviticus 17-18)

Traditional Judaism teaches that the Noahide laws are the only laws in the Bible that apply to the Gentiles (non-Jews); however, Messianic Judaism believe that most of the Torah does apply to Gentiles except that which is specifically or directly given to the Jews.

The Rabbis wrote a special blessing to be prayed on the occasion of seeing a rainbow in the sky:

"Blessed are You, LORD our G-d,King of the Universe, who remembers the covenant, is faithful to His covenant and establishes His Word.



NOAH'S SIN AND HIS SONS LINEAGE

- 18 And the bnei Noach, that went forth of the tevah, were Shem, and Cham, and Yephet; and Cham is the av of Kena'an (Canaan). 19 Shloshah (Three) are the bnei Noach; and of them was the kol ha'aretz populated.

- Curse actually meant for all of Ham's line
- Curse opposite of blessing
- No merit attached to either the family of the cursed or the blessed

FIRSTBORN BLESSING



- Same pattern exhibited in NOACH's blessing and in JACOB's blessing
- Like the reading of a will
- Takes place BEFORE death of the father
- Tradition: 1st male son born is the "Firstborn"
- Firstborn Blessing consists of two parts:
 - 1) Right to Authority
 - 2) Right to Wealth
- Double-portion = firstborn gets double wealth of his siblings



- Of Noach's 3 sons, 2 got blessings, 1 got a curse
- Firstborn blessings TRANSFERS leadership and wealth of family to the next generation
- By Tradition, Firstborn son gets BOTH the authority and the wealth
- BUT...in Noach's blessing, the blessing was split:
 Shem got AUTHORITY Yefet got WEALTH (fruitfulness)
- Exact same thing occurred with Jacob (Israel) blessing upon his sons
- Judah got AUTHORITY Joseph got WEALTH
- Ham's son CANAAN is the founder of THE LAND OF CANAAN
- Noach dies at 950 years old!

Notes:

Noah lived 350 years after the flood and Shem 500 years. Date for the flood is ~3600 BC.

The confusion of tongues at the tower of Babel occurred not long after the flood, (~250 yrs). The world population at that time may only have been only 2000-10,000 persons (Henry Morris, Genesis). The nations then scattered from Babylon, Continents separated in the time of Peleg, about 530 yrs after the Flood. Ice age followed continental division.






TOWER OF BABEL
