

My Questions

“Jewish study focuses not on simple absorption of material, but on a dialogue among students and between students and the text. In fact, not only is there an emphasis on dialogue but on disagreement. Jews often study in “havruta” – in pairs – with each member of the havruta challenging and asking questions of the other. A person who walks into a traditional beit midrash (house of study) is struck immediately by the noise level – havrutot, read the text aloud and often argue at some volume, pushing one another to come to a better understanding of the text at hand.” (Judaism: How to Properly Study the Torah, Jewish Virtual Library)
