2. Did the Hebrews believe in salvation by works or by grace?
3. In what way is Jesus a *tevah* (ark) for His followers today?
4. What is the great deep? How does it connect the Flood and the Tribulation?
5. What is the *Ruach HaKodesh*? How is it an example of the Reality of Duality in Genesis 8:1?
6. What was Noah's first action when he left the ark? What do we see about God's provision in this action?
7. After the Flood, God admitted, "The human heart forms evil from an early age." What does this tell us about our responsibility for our sin and Satan's role in our moral choices?
8. What was "food" to the Hebrews?
9. Discuss the significance of the number forty in Scripture. What was its symbolic meaning? Give examples of its occurrence.
10. When studying the Torah, what question should we not ask and what should we look for instead?
